Similarly, the Czech Republic excels in integrating cultural and religious tourism by promoting UNESCO-listed monasteries and organizing historical festivals that attract pilgrims and tourists alike. Hungary's Budapest stands out with its impressive churches and monasteries, including St. Stephen's Basilica, which combines religious significance with architectural grandeur. Slovakia and Romania have also made notable strides in preserving and promoting their religious heritage, further enriching the region's appeal as a hub for religious tourism.

Given the country's rich spiritual and cultural assets, Ukraine has profound potential for religious tourism. Iconic sites such as the Kyiv-Pechersk Lavra, with its ancient underground caves and majestic churches, and the Sviatohirsk Lavra, situated on the scenic banks of the Siversky Donets, are internationally recognized pilgrimage destinations [6]. Historical churches like St. Sophia Cathedral in Kyiv and the Assumption Cathedral in Kharkiv are invaluable cultural and religious landmarks. Despite this wealth of resources, the development of religious tourism in Ukraine faces significant challenges. The ongoing military conflict has severely impacted infrastructure, resulting in the loss of many tourists and recreational facilities. Limited funding further constrains efforts to restore and modernize religious sites, hindering their ability to meet contemporary standards of comfort and safety [7; 8]. Moreover, the decline in business activity within the tourism sector poses additional barriers, with many operators struggling to adapt to the new realities or ceasing operations altogether.

To realize the full potential of religious tourism, Ukraine must adopt a multifaceted approach that addresses existing challenges through strategic interventions and targeted investments. Infrastructure modernization is paramount to enhancing the tourist experience and ensuring visitor satisfaction. This involves upgrading physical facilities such as rest areas, information centers, and sanitary amenities while developing digital resources. Interactive maps, audio guides, and mobile applications offering real-time information about religious sites can significantly enhance accessibility and engagement. Improved transport connectivity is equally crucial; ensuring seamless access to religious destinations will dramatically bolster their attractiveness to domestic and international visitors.

Cultural sensitivity and local community engagement are essential to sustainable religious tourism development. Respect for religious norms and traditions must be a guiding principle to prevent misunderstandings and conflicts. Training programs for staff on cultural and religious aspects and establishing clear guidelines for tourist interactions can foster a respectful and

inclusive environment. Actively involving local communities in planning and managing religious tourism initiatives is vital for preserving the authenticity of sacred sites and fostering a sense of ownership among residents. Such collaboration also can stimulate local economies by generating employment opportunities and supporting small businesses.

Virtual and augmented reality experiences can provide immersive ways for tourists to explore sacred sites, even remotely [3]. Artificial intelligence can be leveraged to design personalized travel itineraries that cater to individual interests and preferences, enhancing the overall travel experience. Online booking platforms and digital guides further streamline the planning process, making religious tourism more accessible and efficient.

Safety and crisis management are critical priorities in ensuring the well-being of tourists. Developing robust safety protocols, including evacuation and emergency response plans, is essential.
